1	A RESOLUTION
2	To commend Linda Willey Muffoletto for her exemplary public service to the Legislature
3	of Louisiana, in particular, the Louisiana Senate where she served so faithfully for
4	over four decades, and to extend to her a hardy congratulations upon a richly
5	deserved retirement.
6	WHEREAS, it is with great pride that the Senate recognizes and honors Linda
7	Muffoletto as one of its finest and longest serving employees; and
8	WHEREAS, during her tenure as Senate Calendar Clerk, Linda performed her
9	clerical duties and orchestrated desk operations with seamless proficiency, always exhibiting
10	excellent organizational skills and attention to detail; and
11	WHEREAS, hired in 1974 by Senate Secretary C. W. Roberts, Linda began her
12	employment by training alongside Barbara Howard; it was a time of "pencil and paper"
13	recordkeeping, long before the speed and automation of digital technology found in today's
14	chamber; and
15	WHEREAS, during that time, Linda also coordinated the letting of legislative
16	contracts for printed materials through Emprint Moran Printing and she handled the timely
17	receipt, delivery, and distribution of legislative instruments, journals, and other printed
18	matter, all with meticulous accounting of transactions; and

1	WHEREAS, Linda has always garnered the admiration of her peers for her excellent
2	work product, her enthusiasm, her warmth of spirit, and friendly demeanor; she has
3	demonstrated a steady hand and quiet aplomb while coordinating the interaction between
4	proposed legislation and journal copy; and
5	WHEREAS, Linda applied her talents during the administrations of nine presiding
6	officers of the Senate, which include Lieutenant Governor James Fitzmorris, Michael
7	O'Keefe, Sammy Nunez, Allen Bares, Randy Ewing, John Hainkel, Don Hines, Joel
8	Chaisson, and John Alario, and three Senate Secretaries, which include C. W. Roberts,
9	Michael Baer, and Glenn Koepp; and
10	WHEREAS, during these forty years of service, Linda has been "on the desk" for
11	forty-one regular legislative sessions and thirty-nine extraordinary sessions and has near
12	perfect attendance with the exception of a one-day absence due to an eye ailment; and
13	WHEREAS, Linda has quite an industrious work ethic as evidenced by the fact that
14	legislative sessions are just an accompaniment to her regular full-time employment at
15	Southern Media and Opinion Research; and
16	WHEREAS, Linda has leisure interests that include stamp collecting, known as
17	philately, and in earlier years she was an active member of the Civil Air Patrol, the civilian
18	auxiliary of the United States Air Force; her interest in aviation was sparked by her father
19	who was in the English Royal Air Force; she attained the rank of commander and has won
20	national awards for her service; and
21	WHEREAS, Linda Willey was born in Pontiac, Michigan, to parents, Eric and Sylvia
22	Willey, both natives of Great Britain; her family moved to New Orleans where she attended
23	public school, graduating in 1967 from John F. Kennedy High School in its first senior class;

25	WHEREAS, she was an exceptionally gifted student who matriculated to Louisiana
26	State University where she met and later married the love of her life, Joseph Muffoletto; and
27	WHEREAS, Linda has always put her family first with her husband of forty-five
28	years, Joseph, and their two sons, Joseph Vincent II (J. J.) and wife Jamie and their daughter
29	Marie, and Richard (Richie) and his wife, Michelle; and
30	WHEREAS, she has had a positive affect on the efficiency and effectiveness of the

legislative process with her "can do" attitude, her critical thinking and problem-solving
skills, and her commitment of over forty years with the Senate exemplifies all of the
extraordinary qualities of an exceptional public servant; and

WHEREAS, in retirement Linda has many memories to recall from the past four decades, such as colorful legislators with controversial issues, the camaraderie shared with her colleagues on the desk, or the times when her young children sat at the rail dressed in their pajamas and slippers waiting patiently for Mommy to wrap up the "legislative day" in the chamber; and
