(b) In an eligible college or university other than as provided for in Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph shall be awarded by the state an amount determined by the administering agency to equal the weighted average of amounts paid to students attending an eligible public college or university that does not offer

an academic undergraduate degree at the baccalaureate level.

Section 3. References to R.S. 17:5002(D) in this Act refer to this Subsection as enacted in the Act that originated as House Bill No. 705 of this 2015 Regular Session of the Legislature.

- 4 Section 4.(A) Sections 1 and 2 of this Act are intended to achieve the same purpose
- 5 but are drafted differently. Section 1 amends provisions of law as they are presently.
- 6 Section 2 amends provisions of law as they will be if House Bill No. 705 of this 2015
- 7 Regular Session of the Legislature becomes law. Only one of the two Sections shall be
- 8 given effect as specifically provided in Section 5 of this Act.
- 9 (B) Regarding any conflict between the provisions of this Act and the provisions of the Act that originated as House Bill No. 705 of this 2015 Regular Session of the Legislature, the provisions of this Act shall supercede and control regardless of the order of passage.
- Section 5.(A) If House Bill No. 705 of this 2015 Regular Session of the Legislature becomes law, the provisions of Section 1 of this Act shall not become effective.

**Abstract:** Provides that a student may only use a TOPS-Tech Award for degrees and programs aligned with state workforce priorities as determined by the Bd. of Regents and the La. Workforce Investment Council; applicable beginning with students graduating from high school in the 2016-17 school year.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS) as a program of merit scholarships for students attending certain postsecondary education institutions who meet specific academic requirements and other qualifications. Provides for the TOPS-Tech Award for students who enroll in certain colleges and universities to pursue skill or occupational training, including vocational or technical education certificates or diploma programs or nonacademic undergraduate degrees.

<u>Proposed law</u>, applicable to students graduating from high school during the 2016-17 school year and thereafter, provides that students may only use a TOPS-Tech Award if enrolled in those associate's degree (academic or nonacademic) or shorter-term training and education programs that the Bd. of Regents and the La. Workforce Investment Council determine are aligned with state workforce priorities. However, an otherwise eligible student who had

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previously received an award and enrolled in such a program may continue to use the award if such board and council determine that the program is no longer aligned with such priorities.
