# BY SENATORS JOHNS, MORRISH AND JOHN SMITH AND REPRESENTATIVES KLECKLEY AND HENSGENS

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 27:96(A)(2)(a), relative to the Louisiana Riverboat Economic
3	Development and Gaming Control Act; to authorize certain elected public officials
4	to engage in the business activities with a gaming licensee as non-key gaming
5	employee under certain circumstances; to provide for an effective date; and to
6	provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. $27:96(A)(2)(a)$ is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
9	§96. Contracts prohibited; gaming operator; public officials; penalties
10	Α.

12	(2)(a)(i) An elected public official as defined in R.S. 42:1 who is a member
13	of a governing authority of a parish who was elected to his initial term in 2004, may
14	engage in any business activity with a any licensee if he is a non-key gaming
15	employee as defined by R.S. 27:3, if such and his employment with a licensee
16	commenced at least four years prior to holding elective public office.
17	(ii) If the employment of an elected public official to whom the
18	provisions of Item (i) of this Subparagraph are applicable is terminated, nothing
19	in this Subsection shall prohibit the elected public official from being
20	subsequently employed by a licensee as a non-key gaming employee as defined
21	in R.S. 27:3 or as an employee whose duties do not involve access to a designated
22	gaming area of the licensee.

#### **ENROLLED**

1	Section 2. The provisions of this Act shall be given prospective and retroactive
2	application.
3	Section 3. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
4	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
5	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
6	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
7	effective on the day following such approval.
