6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 47:6007(B)(8) and (D)(5) is hereby amended and reenacted to read
8	as follows:
9	§6007. Motion picture investor tax credit

11	B. Definitions. For the purposes of this Section:

13	(8) "Payroll" means all salary, wages, and other compensation, including
14	benefits paid to an employee for services relating to a state-certified production and
15	taxable in this state as verified by the office through the use of information which
16	may be provided to them upon request by the office from the Louisiana
17	Workforce Commission, or the Department of Revenue. Any information so
18	furnished shall be considered and held confidential and privileged by the
19	<b>Department of Economic Development</b> . However, "payroll" for purposes of the
20	additional tax credit for Louisiana-resident payroll shall exclude any portion of an
21	individual salary in excess of one million dollars.

**SB NO. 101 ENROLLED** (5) A motion picture production company applying for the additional credit for the employment of Louisiana residents must remit a schedule to the Department of Revenue, in a machine-sensible format approved by the secretary of the Department of Revenue, that includes the following information: the names of all persons who received salary, wages, or other compensation for services performed in Louisiana in connection with the state-certified production, and the address, taxpayer identification number, permanent address of, and the amount of compensation for services performed in Louisiana received by each such person. Such information shall be verified by the office through the use of information which may be provided to them upon request by the office from the Louisiana Workforce Commission or the Department of Revenue. Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2015; if vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on July 1, 2015, or on the day following such approval by the legislature, whichever is later.
