SCHOOLS: Requires high schools to keep automated external defibrillators on their premises

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 40:1137.3(E)(2), relative to entities in possession of automated
3 external defibrillators; to require that each high school have an automated external
4 defibrillator on its premises; and to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 40:1137.3(E)(2) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

7 §1137.3. Persons in possession of AEDs; training, testing, and notification
8 requirements; manufacturer responsibility; possession required

12 (2) Each high school ~~that participates in interscholastic athletics~~ shall have
13 an AED on its premises, ~~if funding is available~~.

15 Section 2.(A) The legislature hereby declares that the safety of young persons and
16 the timely, effective provision of emergency medical services are public health priorities of
17 this state.

18 (B) This Act shall be known as the "Teddy Daigle and Shane Ozene Act".

Abstract: Requires high schools to keep automated external defibrillators on their premises.

Present law provides that each high school that participates in interscholastic athletics shall have an automated external defibrillator on its premises, if funding is available.

Proposed law revises present law to delete references to interscholastic athletics and funding availability, and thereby provide that each high school shall have an automated external defibrillator on its premises.

Proposed law provides a legislative declaration indicating that the safety of young persons and the timely, effective provision of emergency medical services are public health priorities of this state.

Proposed law provides that it shall be known as the "Teddy Daigle and Shane Ozene Act".
