CIVIL SERVICE/FIRE & POL: Provides relative to the secretary for the municipal fire and police civil service board in the city of Lafayette

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 33:2476.5, relative to the city of Lafayette; to provide relative to the municipal  
3 fire and police civil service board; to provide relative to filling the office of board  
4 secretary; to provide relative to salary of the secretary; and to provide for related  
5 matters.

6 Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published  
7 as provided by Article III, Section 13 of the Constitution of  
8 Louisiana.

9 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

10 Section 1. R.S. 33:2476.5 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

11 §2476.5. City of Lafayette municipal fire and police civil service board; board  
12 secretary

13 Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 33:2476(L)(1), the municipal fire and  
14 police civil service board in the city of Lafayette may fill the office of secretary by  
15 employing any person on a full-time basis. The board shall pay such person an  
16 amount that is within a salary range that is comparable to the salary range established  
17 by the Lafayette city-parish consolidated government for classified personnel  
18 employed in similar administrative positions.

**Abstract:** Relative to the municipal fire and police civil service board in the city of Lafayette, authorizes the board to use an alternative method in filling the office of board secretary.

Present constitution creates a fire and police civil service system applicable to municipalities of over 13,000 in population and parishes and fire protection districts. Provides that the system is subject to Art. XIV, §15.1 of the 1921 constitution made statutory by the 1974 constitution.

Present law creates and provides for two fire and police civil service systems: (1) one applicable to any municipality which operates paid police and fire departments and which has a population of not fewer than 13,000 persons; and (2) one applicable to any parish, fire protection district, or municipality with a population of fewer than 13,000, but not fewer than 7,000 persons.

Present law relative to both systems, provides that a municipal fire and police civil service board is created in each municipality, parish, and fire protection district. Provides that the board shall be composed of five members who shall serve without compensation. Further provides that the board shall have a chairman, vice-chairman, and a secretary.

Proposed law retains present law.

Present law relative to the system applicable to municipalities with a population of not fewer than 13,000, provides that at the discretion of the board, the office of secretary must be filled in one of the following ways:

- (1) By electing one of its members thereto.
- (2) By appointing the city clerk, or secretary-treasurer of the municipality to fill such office ex officio.
- (3) By employing on a part-time basis any other person and paying a salary not to exceed \$1,250 per month which salary must be approved by the municipal governing authority.

Proposed law retains present law but provides an exception for the city of Lafayette. Authorizes the board to fill the office of secretary by employing any person on a full-time basis. Requires the board to pay the person an amount that is within a salary range that is comparable to the salary range established by Lafayette for classified personnel employed in similar administrative positions.
