Morrish

<u>Present law</u> provides relative to the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS) as a program of merit scholarships for students attending certain postsecondary education institutions and who meet specific grade point average (GPA), ACT score, and core curriculum requirements and certain other qualifications.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the state's average composite ACT score be rounded to the nearest whole number.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides instead that the state's average composite ACT score be truncated to the nearest whole number.

<u>Proposed law</u> increases the minium ACT test score required for initial eligibility for an Opportunity Award for students graduating from high school during or after the 2019-2020 school year <u>from</u> a 20 to a 21.

<u>Present law</u> provides for exceptions to the eligibility requirements. <u>Proposed law</u> retains these exceptions, but recodifies them into a new provision of law.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
