SECRETARY OF STATE: Provides for certain commercial filings to be submitted electronically

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 9:3402(B), R.S. 12:1-120(D) and (J) and 1701(A), (C), and (D)
3	and to enact R.S. 9:3402(D), R.S. 12:1-120(M), R.S. 45:1364.1, and R.S. 51:195,
4	relative to commercial filings submitted to the secretary of state; to provide with
5	respect to definitions; to provide for online filings and related requirements; to
6	provide for the applicability of online filing provisions to certain required
7	commercial filings as provided in certain areas of the law; to remove provisions
8	relative to digital signatures and in-person filing requirements; and to provide for
9	related matters.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. R.S. 9:3402(B) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 9:3402(D) is
12	hereby enacted to read as follows:
13	§3402. Filing

15	B.(1) The secretary of state may accept any filing authorized by this Title by
16	electronic, online, or facsimile transmission. All electronic online filings authorized
17	by this Title shall include an electronic or digital signature.
18	(2) "Digital signature" means a type of electronic signature that transforms
19	a message using an asymmetric crypt system such that a person having the initial
20	message and the signer's public key can accurately determine:

15	Section 2. R.S. 12:1-120(D) and (J), 1701(A), (C), and (D) are hereby amended and
16	reenacted and R.S. 12:1-120(M) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
17	§1-120. Requirements for documents; extrinsic facts

19	D. The document must be typewritten or printed or, if electronically
20	transmitted electronically or online, it must be in a format that can be retrieved or
21	reproduced in typewritten or printed form. The inclusion of handwritten notations
22	or entries on a typewritten or printed document does not affect the eligibility of the
23	document for filing.

25	J. The document must be delivered to the office of the secretary of state for
26	filing. Delivery may be made by electronic or online transmission if and to the
27	extent permitted by the secretary of state. If it is filed in typewritten or printed form
28	and not transmitted electronically or online, the secretary of state may require one

1	exact or conformed copy to be delivered with the document, except as provided in
2	R.S. 12:1-503.

8	A.(1) The secretary of state may accept any filing authorized by this Title by
9	electronic, online, or facsimile transmission. All electronic online filings authorized
10	by this Title shall include an electronic or digital signature.

7	and the employee verifies the identity of the person signing the instrument
8	Notwithstanding the provisions of this Section, any filing authorized by this Title
9	that the secretary of state has the capability to accept online shall be filed only on the

12	Section 3. R.S. 45:1364.1 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
13	§1364.1 Filing Methods
14	A.(1) The secretary of state may accept any filing authorized in Chapter 10
15	of this Title by electronic, online or facsimile transmission. All online filings
16	authorized pursuant to the provisions of this Section shall include an electronic
17	signature.
18	(2) "Electronic signature" means an electronic sound, symbol, or process
19	attached to or logically associated with a record and executed or adopted by a person
20	with the intent to sign the record.
21	(3) "Online" means through the secretary of state's commercial online
22	computer system.
23	B. Filing by facsimile. Printed documents transmitted through the process
24	of an electronic method to the secretary of state are deemed to be properly signed
25	when the document received by a facsimile machine or document image attachment
26	in email by the commercial division, office of the secretary of state, purports to be
27	a copy of the original document and contains the signatures required in this Section.
28	C.(1) Online filing. The secretary of state is authorized to implement and
29	establish procedures and systems for secure online-form filing for the filing of any

13	A.(1) The secretary of state may accept any filing required in Chapters 1 and
14	7 of this Title by electronic, online or facsimile transmission. All online filings
15	authorized pursuant to the provisions of this Section shall include an electronic
16	signature.
17	(2) "Electronic signature" means an electronic sound, symbol, or process
18	attached to or logically associated with a record and executed or adopted by a person
19	with the intent to sign the record.
20	(3) "Online" means through the secretary of state's commercial online
21	computer system.
22	B. Filing by facsimile. Printed documents transmitted through the process
23	of an electronic method to the secretary of state are deemed to be properly signed

Abstract: Provides for online filing of documents required to be filed with the La. secretary of state.

Present law defines "digital signature". Proposed law deletes present law.

<u>Present law</u> provides for certain requirements for persons making in-person filings with the secy. of state. <u>Proposed law</u> deletes <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the secy. of state may accept any filings as required in <u>present law</u> (The provisions of Title 12, Chapter 1 of Title 9, Chapter 10 of Title 45, and Chapters 1 and 7 of Title 51), by means of electronic, online or facsimile transmission.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that all online filings are required to include an electronic signature.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "electronic signature" as an electronic sound, symbol, or process attached to or logically associated with a record and executed or adopted by a person with the intent to sign the record.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that "online" means a filing made through the secy. of state's commercial online computer system.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for filing by facsimile. Provides that printed documents transmitted through an electronic method to the secy. of state are deemed properly signed when the document received by a facsimile machine or document image attachment in email by the commercial division, office of the secy. of state, purports to be a copy of the original document and contains the signatures required in proposed law.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for online filing. The secy. of state is authorized to implement and establish procedures and systems for secure online-form filing for the filing of any instrument required to be filed with the secy. of state pursuant to the provisions of <u>present</u> law.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that any provision that requires an instrument filed with the secy. of state to be subscribed or acknowledged before a notary public may be dispensed with if the instrument is filed online and signed electronically, as provide in <u>proposed law</u>, by a person authorized to sign the instrument.

<u>Proposed law provides that any filing authorized in present law</u> that the secy. of state has the capability to accept online are required to be filed only on the secy. of state's commercial online computer system.
