Peterson

<u>Present law</u> provides that at least once a year, the clerk of court must conduct a general course of instruction for commissioners, which must be open to the public.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the clerk of court to create a uniform standardized course of instruction for commissioners that will be used in each parish to train commissioners.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires every person who wants to serve as a commissioner to attend an annual training course and receive a satisfactory score on the test to obtain a certificate which will allow them to serve as a commissioner on Election Day.

<u>Present law</u> provides the clerk of court is not required to conduct the pre-election course of instruction if at least 14 days before the election, he mails a notice to each commissioner informing them that the training course will not be conducted. For purposes of compensation, the commissioners are treated as though they completed the training course.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the clerk of court to conduct the uniformed standardized training pre-election course of instruction annually.

Effective August 1, 2016.
