CHILDREN. Provides relative to the Council on the Status of Grandparents Raising Grandchildren. (gov sig)

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 36:4(B)(8), to enact R.S. 46:2605.1 through 2605.3, and to
3	repeal R.S. 36:478(L) and R.S. 46:2911 through 2913, relative to the Council on the
4	Status of Grandparents Raising Grandchildren; to provide for the transfer of this
5	council from the Department of Children and Family Services to the office of the
6	governor; to provide for the council's membership, responsibilities and duties, and
7	its fund; to provide terms, conditions, requirements, and procedures; and to provide
8	for related matters.
9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
10	Section 1. R.S. 36:4(B)(8) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
11	§4. Structure of executive branch of state government
12	* * *
13	B. The office of the governor shall be in the executive branch of state
14	government.
15	* * *
16	(8) The Children's Cabinet and the Children's Cabinet Advisory Board, as
17	more specifically provided in R.S. 46:2601 through 2607, and the Council on the

1	Status of Grandparents Raising Grandchildren, as more specifically provided
2	in R.S. 46:2605.1 through 2605.3, shall be placed within the office of the governor.
3	* * *
4	Section 2. R.S. 46:2605.1 through 2605.3 are hereby enacted to read as follows:
5	§2605.1. Council on the Status of Grandparents Raising Grandchildren
6	A. There is hereby established the Council on the Status of Grandparents
7	Raising Grandchildren, hereinafter referred to as the "council" as a
8	subcommittee of the Children's Cabinet Advisory Board. The domicile of the
9	council shall be in the parish of East Baton Rouge.
10	B. The council shall be composed of the following members:
11	(1) The chair of the Children's Cabinet Advisory Board, or his designee.
12	(2) The secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services, or
13	his designee.
14	(3) The secretary of the Department of Health and Hospitals, or his
15	designee.
16	(4) The superintendent of the Department of Education, or his designee.
17	(5) The executive director of the Louisiana Workforce Commission, or
18	his designee.
19	(6) The deputy secretary of the Department of Public Safety and
20	Corrections, Youth Services, office of juvenile justice.
21	(7) A member of the Senate to be appointed by the president of the
22	Senate.
23	(8) A member of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the
24	speaker of the House of Representatives.
25	(9) The executive director of the Governor's Office of Elderly Affairs, or
26	his designee.
27	(10) The executive director of the Children's Cabinet, or his designee.
28	(11) One member representing and appointed by Agenda for Children.
29	(12) One member representing and appointed by Prevent Child Abuse

1	Louisiana.
2	(13) One member representing and appointed by the Louisiana
3	Children's Trust Fund.
4	(14) No fewer than three and no more than five citizens who have
5	demonstrated a commitment to the rearing of grandchildren by grandparents,
6	to be nominated by the chair of the Children's Cabinet Advisory Board and
7	approved by the council.
8	(15) One member representing and appointed by the National
9	Association of Social Workers.
10	(16) One member representing and appointed by the Louisiana
11	Court-Appointed Special Advocate Association.
12	(17) One member representing and appointed by the Louisiana Council
13	of Juvenile and Family Court Judges.
14	(18) One member representing and appointed by the Louisiana State Bar
15	Association.
16	(19) One representative of the Grandparents Raising Grandchildren
17	Information Center of Louisiana.
18	C. Members of the council shall serve four-year terms and shall not
19	receive any compensation or reimbursement of expenses. Each member of the
20	council shall hold office until the appointment and qualification of his successor.
21	Whenever a vacancy occurs in an appointed position, the vacancy shall be filled
22	in the same manner and under the same terms and conditions as required for
23	the original appointment.
24	D. Meetings of the council shall be held in the city of Baton Rouge. At the
25	first meeting each year the chair and vice chair of the council shall be appointed
26	by the chair of the Children's Cabinet Advisory Board with the consultation
27	and approval of the council. The council may adopt such rules of procedure as
28	are necessary to facilitate orderly conduct of its business.
29	E. The council shall meet at least quarterly. Meetings shall be held on the

1	call of the chair or at the request of at least three members of the council. A
2	majority of the council shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
3	All official actions of the council shall require the affirmative vote of a majority
4	of the quorum.
5	F. All departments, boards, agencies, officers, and institutions of the
6	state and all subdivisions thereof shall cooperate with the council in carrying
7	out its purposes pursuant to R.S. 46:2605.1 through 2605.3.
8	G. The council shall make, or cause to be made, all such studies, reviews,
9	or analyses which it finds necessary to effect its purpose.
10	H. The council may receive and expend funds appropriated or otherwise
11	made available by the legislature or from any other source, including donations
12	or gifts of money or services from public or private organizations or from any
13	other sources, to be utilized for the purposes of the council and as further
14	provided in R.S. 46:2605.3.
15	§2605.2. Council; responsibilities and duties
16	A. The council shall be a resource to the state on issues affecting
17	grandparents raising grandchildren in the state. In furtherance of that
18	responsibility, the council shall undertake efforts to provide for the following:
19	(1) Foster unity among grandparents raising grandchildren communities
20	and organizations in the state by promoting cooperation and sharing of
21	information and encouraging collaboration and joint activities.
22	(2) Serve as a liaison between government and private interest groups
23	with regard to matters of unique interest and concern to grandparents raising
24	grandchildren in the state.
25	(3) Assess programs and practices in all state agencies as they affect
26	grandparents raising grandchildren, as the council deems necessary and
27	appropriate.
28	(4) Identify and discuss best practices as they affect grandparents raising
29	grandchildren and explore how these practices can be adapted to programs and

1	services being provided within the state.
2	(5) Advise executive and legislative bodies of the potential effect of
3	proposed legislation on grandparents raising grandchildren, as the council
4	deems necessary and appropriate.
5	(6) Investigate the merits of the establishment of a state agency or
6	program within a department dedicated to grandparents' issues and determine
7	how such agency or program would be set up.
8	(7) Identify a system for educating grandparents who lack the
9	appropriate information and resources regarding the care and custody of their
10	grandchildren.
11	(8) Identify issues that are faced by nonparent relatives providing
12	primary care for children.
13	B. The council shall issue its annual report by January 1st each year,
14	stating the findings, conclusions, and recommendations of the council. The
15	council shall submit the report to the governor, the president of the Senate, the
16	speaker of the House of Representatives, and the chairmen of the committees
17	with appropriate jurisdiction in the House of Representatives and in the Senate.
18	§2605.3 Status of Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Fund
19	A. There is hereby created in the state treasury, as a special fund, the
20	Status of Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Fund, hereinafter referred to
21	as the "fund".
22	B. (1) The source of monies deposited into the fund shall be any monies
23	appropriated annually by the legislature, including federal funds, any public or
24	private donations, gifts, or grants from individuals, corporations, nonprofit
25	organizations, or other business entities which may be made to the fund, and
26	any other monies which may be obtained or provided by law.
27	(2) Monies in the fund shall be invested in the same manner as monies
28	in the state general fund and interest earned on investment of monies in the
29	fund shall be credited to the state general fund. Unexpended and unencumbered

1 monies in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the fund. 2 C. Subject to an annual appropriation by the legislature, monies in the 3 fund shall be used as directed by the council solely for the purposes set forth in 4 R.S. 46:2605.1 and 2605.2. Section 3. R.S. 36:478(L) and R.S. 46:2911 through 2913 are hereby repealed. 5 Section 4. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 6 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 7 8 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 9 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 10 effective on the day following such approval. SB 313 Original

<u>Present law</u> provides that the Council on the Status of Grandparents Raising Grandchildren ("council") is placed within the Department of Children and Family Services and provides for its membership, responsibilities and duties, and its fund.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes <u>present law</u> to provide that the council is moved <u>from</u> the DCFS <u>to</u> the office of the governor and is a subcommittee of the Children's Cabinet Advisory Board.

<u>Proposed law</u> repeals provisions of <u>present law</u> providing for the council's membership, responsibilities and duties, and its fund.

Proposed law provides for the council's membership, responsibilities and duties, and its fund.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
