SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 9

BY SENATOR MILLS

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HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT. Directs the Department of Health and Hospitals to evaluate and report on the number of Bayou Health plans that are necessary and appropriate before releasing another RFP to procure such plans.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2	To authorize and direct the Department of Health and Hospitals to evaluate and report on the
3	number of Bayou Health plans that are necessary and appropriate before releasing
4	another RFP to procure such plans.
5	WHEREAS, the Department of Health and Hospitals launched Bayou Health in 2012
6	as a new model of providing Medicaid services to Louisiana residents through the use of
7	managed care organizations; and
8	WHEREAS, prior to implementing Bayou Health, the Medicaid program operated
9	on a fee-for-service system where providers had one entity to bill for services rendered to
10	Medicaid recipients; and
11	WHEREAS, since its inception, the department has twice issued Requests for
12	Proposals (RFP), in both 2011 and in 2014, and subsequently contracted with five health
13	management organizations both times; and
14	WHEREAS, this has been an issue of constant frustration in the provider community
15	as networks, contracting, billing, prior authorizations, preferred drug lists, and many other
16	components of care are now in six different silos made up of five Bayou Health plans and
17	the population remaining in fee-for-service; and
18	WHEREAS, health care providers are having to spend a considerable amount of time

maneuvering through all five Bayou Health plans and the burden has only increased since pharmacy, dental and more recently, behavioral health care have all been rolled into Bayou Health; and

WHEREAS, the burden on recipients has also generated much frustration as many are not aware of their plan or the providers and services covered under their plan until they are issued a denial, and then they find it quite complicated to resolve without having to go to their legislator; and

WHEREAS, although many individuals have expressed concern with the use of five health plans to administer Bayou Health, the actual number of Bayou Health plans is currently completely within the discretion of the Department of Health and Hospitals; and WHEREAS, Louisiana Medicaid recipients need to have access to health care providers, but those same providers are steadily exiting the program due to inadequate provider rates and the overwhelming burden of dealing with five Bayou Health plans; and

WHEREAS, before another RFP is issued in Summer 2017, and before any attempt to exercise an extension of any of the current contracts is made, a thorough evaluation should be conducted by the Department of Health and Hospitals to ensure that they are meeting the needs of Louisiana Medicaid recipients in the most appropriate manner that is not unduly burdensome on the providers who administer their care.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby direct the Department of Health and Hospitals to evaluate and report on the number of Bayou Health plans that are necessary and appropriate before releasing another RFP to procure such plans or exercising any option to extend the term of the current plan contracts.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in conducting its evaluation, the department shall consider the minimum number of health plans that would be allowed by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), the number of health plans in other states that have Medicaid managed care, and the minimum number of plans that would be needed to appropriately manage the population of recipients.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in developing the report, the department should consider such factors as complaint history and satisfaction with any of the five plans based on recipient and provider complaints.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the department shall include any other such information as is necessary in evaluating this issue and submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Louisiana Legislature no later than January 1, 2017.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the secretary of the Department of Health and Hospitals.
