WHEREAS, she is a New Orleans native who completed a Bachelor of Science in chemistry at Xavier University of New Orleans, an MD degree at Tulane University School of Medicine, and Psychiatry Residency training at Albert Einstein College of Medicine in Bronx, New York, was the first fellow to complete a Substance Abuse Fellowship at Tulane in 1991, and is board certified in both Adult General and Addiction Psychiatry; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Head-Dunham advanced the skills, knowledge and application of standards of care in the treatment of co-occurring mental illness and addictive disorders for a broad array of providers and stakeholders, both statewide and nationally; and

WHEREAS, her academic appointment as Clinical Assistant Professor of Psychiatry is served at both Tulane and LSU Schools of Medicine and her academic leadership has, throughout her career, served as a bridge to the behavioral health (substance use and mental illness) knowledge chiasm, pioneering statewide advances in knowledge, skills, and application of standards of care for co-occurring mental and addictive disorders; her work

WHEREAS, in addition to her publications and research accomplishments, Dr. Head-Dunham is a member of several professional, medical, and civic organizations, including Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Incorporated; and

WHEREAS, she resides in New Orleans with her husband and two daughters and is a practicing member of the Baptist faith serving in leadership positions at her local church; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Head-Dunham's last day in the office was Friday, March 11, 2016; and

WHEREAS, her dedicated public service has resulted in better health and welfare of the citizens of Louisiana, and she has also touched the lives of those who have been privileged to learn from, work with, and know her.
