**Abstract:** Requires sheriff and deputy sheriff retirees of the Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office to have 15 or 30 years of continuous and credible service with the Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office in order to have the premiums for certain health and life insurance benefits paid from the sheriff's general fund.

Present law provides that the premium costs of group hospital, surgical, medical expense, and dental insurance and the first \$10,000 of life insurance contracted for under the provisions of present law shall be paid in full from the sheriff's general fund for all sheriffs and deputy sheriffs who retire with at least 15 years of service who are at least 55 years of age or retired with at least 30 years of service at any age.

Present law is applicable only to the sheriffs' offices of the parishes of Acadia, Allen, Avoyelles, Beauregard, Bossier, Caddo, Calcasieu, Caldwell, Cameron, Catahoula, Concordia, East Feliciana, Grant, Iberville, Jackson, Jefferson Davis, Lafayette, Lincoln, Livingston, Morehouse, Natchitoches, Pointe Coupee, Rapides, Red River, St. Bernard, St. James, St. Martin, Tangipahoa, Union, Vermillion, Vernon, Washington, West Baton Rouge, West Carroll, and West Feliciana and the sheriff of the Civil District Court of the parish of Orleans, for their respective retirees.

Proposed law retains present law but further provides that in the parish of Concordia, present law only applies to sheriffs and deputy sheriffs retiring prior to Sept. 1, 2017.

Proposed law retains present law but provides that in the parish of Concordia, these premium costs shall be paid in full from the sheriff's general fund for all sheriffs or deputy sheriffs who retire on or after Sept. 1, 2017, and has:

- (1) Retired from the Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office on or before Sept. 1, 2017, after 15 years of continuous and creditable service and are at least 55 years of age.
- (2) 30 or more years of continuous and creditable service with the Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office at any age.
