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GOVERNMENTAL REGULATIONS. Provides for variances from certain building codes in Terrebonne Parish. (8/1/16)

AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 40:1730.23(J) and (K), relative to Terrebonne Parish; to provide relative to the 3 State Uniform Construction Code; to provide for enforcement of building codes by municipalities and parishes; to authorize municipalities and parishes to modify or 4 5 approve alternatives to provisions of certain building codes; to provide for certain 6 terms, conditions, and procedures; and to provide for related matters. 7 Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published. 8 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 9 Section 1. R.S. 40:1730.23(J) and (K) are hereby enacted to read as follows: 10 §1730.23. Enforcement of building codes by municipalities and parishes 11 J. Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection A of this Section and any 12 13 other law to the contrary, the parish of Terrebonne may modify or approve 14 alternatives, in whole or in part, to any provision or requirement of the 15 International Building Code and the International Mechanical Code if strict compliance with such provision or requirement will create practical difficulties, 16 17 unnecessary hardships, or will otherwise be unwarranted. However, no such

1 modification or approved alternative shall be allowed if it substantially 2 adversely affects provisions for health, safety, and security. 3 K.(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection A of this Section and any other law to the contrary, the parish of Terrebonne may modify or approve 4 alternatives, in whole or in part, to any provision or requirement of the 5 International Building Code or the International Mechanical Code, if the 6 7 modification or approved alternative shows, by the weight of the evidence, that 8 compliance with such provision or requirement of the code would do any of the 9 following: 10 (a) Fail to achieve the intended objective of the code. 11 (b) Inhibit achievement of some other important public policy. 12 (c) Be physically or legally impracticable. 13 (d) Be unnecessary in light of equally safe and proper alternatives or alternatives that, without the loss in the level of safety, achieve the intended 14 objective of the code more efficiently or effectively. 15 (e) Create a change so slight as to produce a negligible additional benefit 16 consonant with the purposes of the code. 17 (2) The permitting department or equivalent in the parish of Terrebonne 18 19 shall be responsible for the issuance of the modification or approved alternative 20 based on the criteria provided in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection. <u>Present law</u> provides that the primary functions of the La. State Uniform Construction Code Council are to review and adopt the State Uniform Construction Code, provide for training and education of code officials, and accept all requests for amendments of the code.

<u>Present law</u> provides that notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary relating to the authority of local governments to enforce construction codes, all municipalities and parishes in this state shall enforce only the construction codes provided for in present law.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides that the parish of Terrebonne may modify or approve alternatives, in whole or in part, to any provision or requirement of the International Building Code and the International Mechanical Code if strict compliance with such

provision or requirement will create practical difficulties, unnecessary hardships, or will otherwise be unwarranted. However, no such modification or approved alternative will be allowed if it substantially adversely affects provisions for health, safety, and security.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the parish of Terrebonne may modify or approve alternatives, in whole or in part, to any provision or requirement of the International Building Code or the International Mechanical Code, if the modification or approved alternative shows by the weight of the evidence that compliance with such provision or requirement of the code would do any of the following:

- (1) Fail to achieve the intended objective of the code.
- (2) Inhibit achievement of some other important public policy.
- (3) Be physically or legally impracticable.
- (4) Be unnecessary in light of equally safe and proper alternatives or alternatives that, without the loss in the level of safety, achieve the intended objective of the code more efficiently or effectively.
- (5) Create a change so slight as to produce a negligible additional benefit consonant with the purposes of the code.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the permitting department or equivalent in the parish of Terrebonne shall be responsible for the issuance of the modification or approved alternative based on the criteria in proposed law.

Effective August 1, 2016.
