PUBLIC CONTRACTS: Requires certain entities to make payments pursuant to certain contracts in a timely fashion

AN ACT

2 To enact Chapter 27 of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statues of 1950, to be comprised 3 R.S. 39:2211, relative to payment of contracts by certain governmental entities; to 4 require governmental entities to pay all obligations arising under public contracts 5 within a certain time; to provide relative to interest for past due payments; to provide 6 relative to claims and disputes regarding payments demanded; and to provide for 7 related matters. 8 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 9 Section 1. Chapter 27 of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statues of 1950, to be 10 comprised R.S. 39:2211, is hereby enacted to read as follows: 11 CHAPTER 27. PAYMENTS UNDER CONTRACT 12 §2211. Payments under contract 13 A. Time for payment by a vendor. A vendor who receives a payment from 14 a governmental entity shall pay a subcontractor the appropriate share of the payment 15 not later than the tenth day after the date the vendor receives the payment. The 16 appropriate share is overdue on the eleventh day after the date the vendor receives 17 the payment. B. Time for payment by subcontractor. A subcontractor who receives a 18 19 payment from a vendor shall pay a person who supplies goods or a service for which 20 the payment is made the appropriate share of the payment not later than the tenth day

1	after the date the subcontractor receives the payment. The appropriate share is
2	overdue on the eleventh day after the date the subcontractor receives the payment.
3	C. Disputed Payment. A governmental entity shall notify a vendor of an
4	error in an invoice submitted for payment by the vendor not later than the twenty-
5	first day after the date the entity receives the invoice.
6	D. Payment of interest by vendor or subcontractor. Payments due on
7	amounts which are not disputed begin to accrue monthly interest on the date the
8	payment becomes overdue. The rate of interest that accrues on an overdue payment
9	is the rate of judicial interest in effect on July first of the fiscal year in which the
10	payment becomes overdue. The governmental entity shall submit the interest
11	payment when it submits the net amount due. Interest on an overdue payment stops
12	accruing on the date the governmental entity or its vendor mails or electronically
13	transmits payment.
14	E. Vendor remedy for nonpayment of contract. A vendor may suspend
15	performance required under a contract with a governmental entity if:
16	(1) The governmental entity does not pay the vendor an undisputed amount
17	within the time limits; and
18	(2) The vendor gives the governmental entity written notice either informing
19	the governmental entity that payment has not been received or stating the intent of
20	the vendor to suspend performance for nonpayment.
21	F. A vendor or subcontractor may not suspend performance with the
22	Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development on any highway,
23	hurricane, road, or emergency-declared project.
24	G. For purposes of this Section, a "governmental entity" is a state agency,
25	parish, or local municipality, incorporated or unincorporated, or any recipient of
26	federal or state funds that utilizes such funds to pay a vendor or subcontractor.

Abstract: Provides relative to obligations due under contracts to governmental entities.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires a vendor who receives a payment from a governmental entity to pay a subcontractor the appropriate share of the payment not later than the tenth day after the date the vendor receives the payment. Specifies that the appropriate share is overdue on the 11th day after the date the vendor receives the payment.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires a subcontractor who receives a payment from a vendor to pay a person who supplies goods or a service for which the payment is made the appropriate share of the payment not later than the tenth day after the date the subcontractor receives the payment. Specifies that the appropriate share is overdue on the 11th day after the date the subcontractor receives the payment.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires a governmental entity to notify a vendor of an error in an invoice submitted for payment by the vendor not later than the 21st day after the date the entity receives the invoice.

<u>Proposed</u> law provides that payments due on amounts which are not disputed begin to accrue monthly interest on the date the payment becomes overdue. Specifies that the rate of interest that accrues on an overdue payment is the rate of judicial interest in effect on July first of the fiscal year in which the payment becomes overdue. Requires the governmental entity to submit the interest payment when it submits the net amount due. Specifies that interest on an overdue payment will stop accruing on the date the governmental entity or its vendor mails or electronically transmits payment.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes a vendor to suspend performance required under a contract with a governmental entity if:

- (1) The governmental entity does not pay the vendor an undisputed amount within the time limits; and
- (2) The vendor gives the governmental entity written notice either informing the governmental entity that payment has not been received or stating the intent of the vendor to suspend performance for nonpayment.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits a vendor or subcontractor from suspending performance with the La. Dept. of Transportation and Development on any highway, hurricane, road, or emergency-declared project.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "governmental entity" as a state agency, parish, or local municipality, incorporated or unincorporated, or any recipient of federal or state funds that utilizes such funds to pay a vendor or subcontractor.
