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**Bill Information:**

**Current Law**

The Louisiana State Police Retirement System (STPOL) provides benefits to those who are totally and permanently disabled. It appears that current law may also provide for disability benefits for members who are partially disabled (see R.S. 11:211). However, there are no provisions in current law that identifies the benefit for those who are only partially disabled.

**Proposed Law**

SB 12 removes “total or partial” disability language, which does not currently apply to any member of STPOL, from the law.

**Implications of the Proposed Changes**

SB 12 provides a remedial change to the law and has no effect on benefits available to members.

**Retirement Systems**

There are no actuarial costs to STPOL associated with SB 12.

**Other Post-Employment Benefits**

There are no actuarial costs associated with SB 12 for post-employment benefits other than pensions.

**Analysis of Fiscal Costs**

SB 12 has no effect on fiscal costs.

**Actuarial Data, Methods and Assumptions**

This actuarial note was prepared using actuarial data, methods, and assumptions as disclosed in the most recent actuarial valuation report adopted by PRSAC. These assumptions and methods are in compliance with actuarial standards of practice. This data, methods, and assumptions are being used to provide consistency with the actuary for the retirement system who may also be providing testimony to the Senate and House retirement committees.

**Actuarial Caveat**

There is nothing in SB 12 that will compromise the signing actuary’s ability to present an unbiased statement of actuarial opinion.
