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CONSERVATION. Requires landowner notification when an operator transfers an oil or gas well. (8/1/16)

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 30:91(B)(1) and to enact R.S. 30:28(J), relative to the

4	provide for orphaned oilfield sites; to provide for requirements of drilling permits;

7	Section 1. R.S. 30:91(B)(1) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 30:28(J) is
8	hereby enacted to read as follows:

12	J. No later than thirty days after the issuance of an amended permit to
13	transfer a well to another operator, the commissioner shall require that the
14	operator to the best of his knowledge identify on a form approved by the
15	commissioner the surface owner of lands on which the well site is located.

17	§91. Orphaned oilfield sites

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B.(1) Prior to declaring a site to be an orphaned oilfield site, the assistant secretary shall seek to notify the last operator of record, at his last known address contained in the department records, of the site that is to be declared orphaned and shall publish a notice in the Louisiana Register that the oilfield site is to be declared orphaned. Additionally, the assistant secretary shall seek to notify the surface owner of the site that is to be declared orphaned when the department has been provided such information pursuant to R.S. 30:28. If resolution of a factual dispute is requested by any owner or operator, the assistant secretary shall hold a fact-finding hearing prior to declaring the site orphaned and the assistant secretary shall make any fact determination necessary to resolve the dispute.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the commissioner of conservation to require the operator identify to the best of his knowledge, on a form approved by the commissioner, the surface owner of lands on which the well site is located, no later than 30 days after the issuance of an amended permit to transfer a well to another operator.

<u>Present law</u> requires the commissioner to seek to notify the last operator of record, at his last known address contained in the department records, of the site that is to be declared orphaned and shall publish a notice in the Louisiana Register that the oilfield site is to be declared orphaned, prior to declaring a site to be an orphaned oilfield site.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and additionally requires the commissioner to seek to notify the surface owner of the site that is to be declared orphaned when the department has been provided such information pursuant to <u>proposed law</u>.

Effective August 1, 2016.
