1 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 2 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 3 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 4 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 5 effective on the day following such approval.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the only exception to dispensing restrictions imposed by <u>present</u> <u>law</u> is if the prescription monitoring information from the state of the prescriber may be viewed by the dispensing pharmacist. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that an additional exception will be if the prescriber includes on the prescription that it is for a patient with a diagnosis of cancer or terminal illness.

Effective upon signature of the governor or upon lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
