Upon receiving fingerprints, the bureau shall survey its criminal history records and identification files and make a simultaneous request of the FBI for like information from other jurisdictions. The bureau shall provide a report promptly and in writing, but shall provide only such information as is necessary to specify whether or not the person has been arrested for or convicted of or pled nolo contendere to any crime or crimes, the crime or crimes of which he has been arrested for or convicted or to which he has pled nolo contendere, and the date or dates on which they occurred. The report provided pursuant to the provisions of this Subsection shall include arrests, convictions, or other dispositions, including any conviction dismissed pursuant to Code of Criminal Procedure Article 893 or 894. The bureau may charge the board a reasonable processing fee for conducting and reporting on any such search."
