(a) At least two thousand verifiable hours as an indentured apprentice at the manual labor of plumbing under the direct, constant, on-the-job supervision of a journeyman or master plumber licensed by the board.

(b) Has worked at At least four thousand two thousand five hundred verifiable hours as an unindentured apprentice or at least three thousand hours as an indentured apprentice at the manual labor of plumbing under the direct, constant, on-the-job supervision of a journeyman or master plumber licensed by the board.

(c) At least one thousand verifiable hours as an unindentured apprentice at the manual labor of plumbing under the direct, constant, on-the-job supervision of a journeyman or master plumber licensed

by the board and holds a certificate of completion of an approved training program through the Louisiana Community and Technical College System, including through a re-entry program.

(3) Has successfully completed any educational requirements established by the board.

(+) (4) Has passed any written or manual examination required by the board.

(+) (5) Has paid the fees established by the board.

(2) The board shall issue a license to any person who qualifies under the state board's regulations and who desires to engage in doing the work of a journeyman plumber if he passes a written and manual journeyman plumber's examination given by the board and pays the fees established by the board.

C.(1) Apprentice plumber. An "apprentice plumber" is a natural person engaged in learning the plumbing trade by working under the direct, on-the-job supervision of a journeyman plumber and in the employ of an employing entity. Apprentice plumbers shall be indentured in an apprenticeship program approved by Louisiana Works ~~or~~, unindentured and in the employ of an employing entity, or unindentured and in the employ of an employing entity while enrolled in an approved training program through the Louisiana Community and Technical College System.

(2) Apprentice gas fitter. An "apprentice gas fitter" is a natural person engaged in learning the gas fitting trade by working under the direct, on-the-job supervision of a gas fitter and in the employ of an employing entity. §1381. Reporting requirements

A. The legislature hereby recognizes the importance of the occupational field of plumbing and the necessity of expanding recruitment, especially in the population of minority students, as the pool of licensed plumbing professionals has not grown at the same pace of need for the occupation. It is the intent of the legislature that the board increase outreach to minority students for recruitment into the occupational field of plumbing.

B. The board, in consultation and collaboration with the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Louisiana Community and Technology College System, and any other vocational programs identified by the board, shall survey all efforts in effect to encourage minority participation in the occupational field of plumbing. No later than April 12, 2027, the board shall submit a report of the survey to the House Committee on Commerce and the Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection and International Affairs. The report shall include but not be limited to the following:

(1) The total number of licensed plumbers as of August 1, 2026.

(2) The number of licenses issued from August 1, 2026, through April 1, 2027, delineating the demographic information of all licensees.

(3) Methods to increase minority participation in the occupational field of plumbing, including recruitment and educational grant opportunities."

(b) The issuer provides a clear, readily accessible medical-necessity exception process and grants an exception for continued coverage of the reference listed drug or reference listed product.

(2) Nothing in this Section shall be construed to require a prescribing provider to prescribe a generic drug or any biological product, or to require an enrollee to switch from a reference listed drug or reference product to a generic drug or any biological product.

F. Confidentiality.

(1) To ensure transparency regarding formulary decisions, the commissioner shall provide an annual report, providing a summary of the notifications under this Section, including an analysis of the overall impact on patient costs.

(2) All information and data obtained by the department pursuant to this Subpart that is not otherwise publicly available is considered to be a trade secret, confidential, and proprietary, is not subject to disclosure pursuant to the Public Records Law, R.S. 44:1 et seq., and shall not be disclosed directly or indirectly.

(3) The Department of Insurance shall impose the confidentiality protections of this Section on any third party that may receive or otherwise have access to this information."

**(3)(a) The office shall not withhold any progress payment or interim disbursement pursuant to this Section. The office may withhold only the final disbursement or closeout payment of a grant, and only if such withholding is authorized by rules promulgated in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act and only after completion of the regular notice, public comment, and legislative oversight process applicable to rulemaking pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act. Such rules shall include notice to the grantee, a statement of the**

**grounds for withholding, and an opportunity for the grantee to cure or respond prior to final agency action.**
