A person who is a minor and who is harmed as a result of being depicted in child sexual abuse material shall have a cause of action for damages against any person that produces, promotes, advertises, distributes, possesses, or possesses with the intent to distribute such visual reproduction, or who coerces, solicits, or uses the minor for the purpose of creating such visual reproduction.

C. The definitions provided in R.S. 14:81.1 shall apply to this Section.

D. The cause of action for damages shall be commenced before the later of either of the following:

(1) The lapse of a twelve-year liberative prescription once the minor reaches the age of majority.

~~(2) the (b)~~ **(b)** The production, manufacture, distribution, or dispensing or possession with intent to produce, manufacture, distribute, or dispense a controlled dangerous substance as defined by

the Louisiana Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Law, ~~shall not be readmitted to bail when the person previously failed to appear and a warrant for arrest was issued and not recalled or the previous bail undertaking has been revoked or forfeited.~~

(c) Any offense involving the possession or use of a firearm.
(d) Any sex offense as defined by R.S. 15:541.

(2) If a person voluntarily appears without confinement by a law enforcement officer or bail recovery agent following a motion to revoke bail or issuance of an arrest warrant for failure to appear but prior to revocation or forfeiture, then he may be released only under one of the following circumstances:

~~(1)(a)~~ **(a)** After a contradictory hearing, a person may be released on the previously posted bail undertaking if the motion to revoke bail is rescinded or the arrest warrant is recalled and the surety is present or represented at the hearing and gives written consent. Previous instances of revocation and forfeiture in unrelated cases are admissible at the hearing. This relief is available only once.

~~(2)(b)~~ **(b)** A person may be released on a new bail undertaking without a contradictory hearing only on bail with a commercial surety and in an amount higher than the original bail.

D. A convicted person shall be remanded to jail to await sentence, **and shall be remanded to custody after sentencing,** unless any of the following occur:

(1) He is allowed to remain free on a bail undertaking posted prior to conviction by operation of Article 331(A), and the bail previously fixed is in accordance with all of the applicable provisions of this Article **and other applicable law.**

(2) He is released by virtue of a bail undertaking posted after conviction, and the bail was fixed in accordance with this Article **and other applicable law. However, post conviction bail is not authorized pursuant to this Article when there is proof of a substantial risk that the person may flee or poses an imminent danger to any other person or the community, including when the court finds the convicted person is likely to commit other crimes while on bail and is therefore a danger to the community.**

G.

(2)(a) After conviction of any crime punishable by imprisonment for twenty-five years or more that is ~~both either~~ a sex offense ~~and or~~ a crime of violence, there shall be a rebuttable presumption that the release of the person convicted will pose a danger to another person or the community and that there is a substantial risk that the person convicted might flee.

(c) This Paragraph applies based on the cumulative maximum sentences for all crimes for which a person was convicted, provided that any crime for which the person has been convicted is a sex offense or crime of violence as defined in this Paragraph.

(d) The Paragraph also applies to any person who has been charged as a habitual offender pursuant to R.S. 15:529.1.

Art. 312.1. Revocation of bail upon subsequent felony arrest

A. If a defendant is admitted to bail for any crime of violence, any sex offense, or any crime involving the possession or use of a firearm, the bail for such offense shall be revoked upon any subsequent arrest for a felony offense that is not a part of the same transaction, occurrence, or criminal episode which resulted in the arrest that is the basis for the defendant's current admittance to bail.

B.(1) Prior to booking the defendant, the arresting agency shall conduct a prompt and diligent search to determine if the defendant is currently on bail for any crime of violence, any sex offense, or any crime involving the possession or use of a firearm.

(2) The arresting agency shall provide the court with the information described in Subparagraph (1) of this Paragraph, along with an updated criminal history with all other booking information, for the court to consider when determining the defendant's entitlement to bail, the amount of bail, and conditions of bail.

C. If the court determines that the defendant is currently on bail for any crime of violence, any sex offense, or any crime

involving the possession or use of a firearm, the bail for such offense shall be revoked upon any subsequent arrest for a felony offense that is not a part of the same transaction, occurrence, or criminal episode which resulted in the arrest that is the basis for the defendant's current admittance to bail. The court shall enter an order revoking such prior bail, pending a bail hearing which may be invoked by the state or the defendant. Either party may seek supervisory review of the granting or denial of any order that revokes the defendant's prior admittance to bail.

D. For the purposes of this Article, the following terms have the following meanings:

(1) "Crime of violence" means any offense defined or enumerated as a crime of violence in R.S. 14:2(B).

(2) "Sex offense" means any offense that requires registration and notification pursuant to R.S. 15:540 et seq.

(b) That the defendant, if equipped with a global positioning monitoring system, comply with the appropriate geographic restrictions, monitoring conditions, and enforcement provisions of R.S. 15:571.36, 571. 37, and 571.38.

(2) Any portion of a record that identifies the name of a donor to the public postsecondary education institution or its affiliated foundation if the donor has requested that his name remain confidential.

(3) Records that contain proprietary, unpublished, or incomplete academic research and unsubmitted grant applications. This exception shall expire upon the disclosure, publication, public announcement, or public knowledge of the research or the grant application, upon the submission of the related grant application, or upon the grant or denial of related intellectual property rights.

(4)(a) Records of negotiations for industry partnerships with the institution upon a determination by the custodian of records that disclosure of the information would have a detrimental effect on the negotiations. The custodian's determination shall be disclosed in response to a request for the records.

(b) No information made confidential pursuant to this Paragraph shall remain confidential for more than twelve months from the date of the custodian's determination that disclosure would be detrimental; however, if the negotiation remains active and the custodian makes a new determination that the disclosure of the information would be detrimental to the negotiations, such information shall remain confidential while the negotiation remains active, not to exceed an additional six months.

B. This Chapter shall not apply to the personally identifiable information of any person who reports a violation of a student code of conduct or other policy intended for the safety of students or employees of a postsecondary education institution, personally identifiable information of any reported witness to the reported violation, and, if the reported violation involves violence or abuse, personally identifiable information of any person who may be a victim of violence or abuse directly related to the reported violation if such information is in the custody or control of the postsecondary education institution or management board

and was received in accordance with adopted, written policies applicable to the postsecondary education institution and the students and employees of the postsecondary education institution, unless access to the information is specifically required by other provisions of law of this state or by federal law or is ordered by a court under rules of discovery.

C. As used in this Article, a defendant includes any person who knowingly aided, abetted, financed, funded, solicited, conspired, or otherwise provided material support or assistance for conduct prohibited by R.S. 14:38.6.

D.(1) Recoverable damages pursuant to this Article may include but are not limited to damages for physical injury, mental anguish, emotional distress, property damage, lost income, interference with the free exercise of religion, and any other damages authorized by law.

(2) In addition to any other remedy provided by law, a court may grant temporary restraining orders, preliminary injunctions, permanent injunctions, or declaratory relief, as well as court costs and reasonable attorney fees, to prevent the conduct, or to prevent the continuation of the conduct, that is prohibited by R.S. 14:38.6."
