(e) One member appointed to represent the Louisiana Association of Independent Colleges and Universities, who shall be the president of Tulane University, or his designee.

(4) The executive director of the consortium shall serve as a nonvoting ex officio member of the commission and shall serve as secretary to the commission.

(5) The members of the commission shall elect a chairman from among its voting members.

(6) The commission shall meet as necessary and may request information, data, reports, and assistance from the consortium and participating institutions in carrying out its duties.

(7) The executive director, as secretary to the commission, shall prepare and submit the written report of the commission as required by in Paragraph (8) of this Subsection.

(8) No later than January 2, 2027, the commission shall submit its written report, in accordance with R.S. 24:771 and 772, to the Senate Committee on Education, the House Committee on Education, the Senate Committee on Finance, the House Committee on Appropriations, and the Board of Regents regarding its findings and recommendations concerning governance reforms, administrative efficiencies, collaborative research opportunities, and strategies to increase federal, private, and external research funding.

(v) "Peace officer" shall also include security personnel employed by a court of appeal of the state of Louisiana.

(vi) "Peace officer" shall also include the director of capitol security and security officers employed by the legislature upon recommendation of the director as provided by R.S. 24:681 et seq.

(b) A peace officer as described in Items (i), (ii), (iv), (v), and (vi) of this Paragraph shall be a United States citizen as defined in this Section."
